# SHELLFISH COMMITTEE MINUTES APRIL 24, 2019

There being a quorum the meeting was brought to order at 5:15PM

- ITEM 1: Minutes of March 2019 meeting read. Moved Powell second Carter to accept minutes vote 6-0
- ITEM 2: Powell reported on the LDL 960 bill. He was not able to attend but after reading the bill he did not feel that it would affect clam sizes and that they would still be regulated by the town.

He also reported that he had attended a Monday night meeting of the Island Heritage Trust and Center for Coastal Fisheries. It was a good meeting and very informative.

- ITEM 3: Powell reported that the application for putting out the seed boxes has been completed and we are now waiting for DEP approval. If it does not come before the May 10th that session will have to be at some later date.
- ITEM 4: Crystal reported that she has contacted dealers to see if any would like to come buy on the island. There are 125 buyers in the state, 49 within 50 miles of us and 21 within 25 miles of us. Coming to us seems to be a big issue for them. Two seemed to be willing but would only come a few times during the summer. Raylene has spoken to the Trenton buyer and they will call her back.
- ITEM 5: Crystal has taken over the Facebook page and will post information. Clammers should check the page for closures etc.
- ITEM 6: How about selling "T" shirts on July 4th Board thought it was a good idea Carter to get some prices

  Crystal thought if each clammer would donate 5# clams they could be steamed and sold on July 4th

  Raylene thought it would be a good idea to have a float in the parade

Shellfish Committee Meeting March 27, 2019

There being a quorum the meeting was brought to order at 5:15PM

ITEM 1: Minutes of February 27, 2019 Moved Powell second Carter to accept minutes Vote 6-0-2

ITEM 2: Robert Ray term ran out and he was not appointed to a new term. He voiced his anger and frustration that this had happened. He has been on the Board for 20 years. It was explained that the Board could recommend but the Selectmen for each town had the deciding factor as to who was appointed. Papers for Ray were not presented to the Selectmen, Powell stated that he had gone to the office to request consideration for appointment and was appointed. The Board decided to offer recommendations to the Selectmen and await their decision.

- ITEM 3: Powell is receiving information about potential laws affecting the clamming industry. LD 960 is coming up for review April 9, 2019 at 1PM at the Cross Building, Augusta. It contains sections on clam size, and collection. Billings stated that this bill may be dead but is important as it involves farming. Powell pointed out that it is important to know about and attend these sessions as it directly affects us on the island.
- ITEM 4: There was a meeting this past Monday about the grant and volunteers for sampling. It was a good meeting but more volunteers are needed. Training will be required of those taking the samples. The samples will be taken in Deep Hole, Long Cove, and Crocketts Cove. Powell asked for a grant oversight subcommittee. Powell, Miller, Robbins and Jim Fisher (DI town manager) will make up the committee.
- ITEM 5: Warden report. Flats are not frozen so more diggers are working but all are licensed and she has had no complaints this month.

Shellfish Committee Meeting January 23, 2019

There being a quorum the meeting was brought to order at 5:15PM

Item 1: Moved Ray second Powell to accept minutes of May 2018 Vote 7-0

- Item 2: Election of officers: Moved Ray second Robbins to nominate Powell as Chairman Vote 7-0

  Moved Ray to nominate Oliver Vice Chairman, Moved Powell to
  nominate Tyler Robbins Vice Chairman after discussion Vote Oliver 7-0

  Moved Ray second Powell to nominate Duncan as Secretary. Vote 7-0
- Item 3: Because of the previous discussion regarding responsibilities of different officers it was suggested that both an operations manual and a job description be written. Robert Ray, George Powell and Paul volunteered to write them. Moved Oliver, second Powell to complete this project Vote 7-0
- Item 4: Fees: In the last meeting fees were adjusted however Commercial Junior and Recreational Senior was omitted. Moved Powell second Robbins to leave these the same. Vote 7-0 Hannah Annis mentioned that non-resident commercial seniors was also not addressed. Even though there never has been anyone in the category it was moved Powell second Oliver to make the fee \$ 200.00. Vote 7-0
- Item 5: Because of a new law the towns cannot adjust the size of clams. Our ordinance section D says we can do so. Therefore the ordinance needs to be modified and remove this section.
- Item 6: Powell has submitted a Shellfish restoration grant application to take water samples in an effort to discover what specie is creating the pollution. The grant request is for \$5,345.80. The grant will be awarded to the winner on February 28th.
- Item 7: There is a new proposed law LD4 regarding seeding, the public meeting regarding it is 2/24/19 in Augusta. Billings, Ray, and Powell do not think this is a good law as far as Deer Island flats are concerned. Hannah Annis has no information on the bill. Billings and Powell cannot go to speak on the issue. Ray and perhaps Oliver and T. Robbins will go.
- Item 8: Conservation events: Raylene suggested cleaning of the flats as they desperately need attention. Powell suggest more recruitment boxes in different locations. Two events should be in April and three in May. Time and type to be decided at the next meeting.
