Minutes June 17, 2019

Duncan brought the meeting to order at 5:35 and requested nominations for Chairman of the Board

Turner nominated Edinger second Eaton, there being no further nominations Duncan requested a vote. Vote 5-0 in favor

Edinger took over the meeting and requested nominations for Vice Chairman. Edinger nominated Turner; Eaton seconded. There being no further nominations Vote 5-0  
Edinger requested nominations for Treasurer. Eaton nominated Buckminster second Turner there being no further nominations Vote 5-0

Item 4: Permits

Map 8A Lot 22 Ryan McCasky requesting seating for 76 (inside and outside) Lunch and dinner will be served 5 days a week, dinner only one day a week. Paper plates will not be used. Hafford has developed a flow chart for the buildings going into the 11,000 tank. According to the calculations this seating with the present configurations of the rest of the building brings the tank up to capacity. However the tank will have to be pumped twice a year and the restaurant grease trap should be pumped once a month. Motion Eaton second Turner to accept the permit with the restriction that the grease trap be pumped monthly and that McCasky pay a prorated portion of the second 11,000 tank pumping. Amount to be calculated. Vote 5-0

Map 7A Lot 50 Mark Gross construction of a tiny house. There is a septic tank already on the vacant property. Move Buckminster to accept second Eaton Vote 5-0

Map 4B Lot 13 Caleb Scott Addition of a tiny house 8' x 30'. House on the property already has four bedrooms. Hafford thought the tank needed to be checked more often to see if extra pumping was required. Moved Pitts second Eaton to accept the permit however due to the size of the existing tank more inspections will be required. If extra pumping is required the cost will be born by the owner. Vote 5-0

Item 5: Operators report

All test passed this month, generators working OK

Pumping tanks have started; 28,755 pumped

Atkinson checked on prices for videoing

Allen Environmental has a push camera only

Ted Berry costs \$ 467.00 hour

Hafford suggested she send out bids to companies she knows that video.


Bids are necessary as part of the project will be paid by a grant

Item 6: Hafford reported that she has spoken to the Town manager about a problem with a rip rap retaining wall, culvert disintegration, and sink holes on the property which includes the 11,000 tank. This must be repaired, if not damage to the 11,000 tank could occur. Hafford suggested that if a standard sea wall was built then there might be the possibility that a 5,000 gallon new tank could be installed next to the existing 11,000 tank. DEP permits, DOT agreement to repair the culvert, New easements from owner of land, and engineering plans all required. Board requested Hafford work with the town to solve the problem.
