Selectmen present: John Robbins, Richard Larrabee Sr., Evelyn Duncan, Travis Fifield, John Steed. Others present: TM Billings, Brad Carter, Anne West, Leslie Landrigan, reporter IAV

Cockatoo Liquor license hearing first-Held hearing. TM had copies of the application. Said the license application was advertised. Application is complete and OK. Did not hear any comments or complaints from the public. Recommends it be approved. Board signed the application and hearing closed.

Minutes from July 18, 2022-Tabled

Weekly Warrants-Motion by Dick, 2nd by Evelyn to approve them. 5-0

- 1. Memorial Ambulance – house/road numbers**-Anne West was in for the ambulance who was out on a call. She was advocated on buying address plates for house numbers or mail boxes. Said other towns have been doing them. Easier for the ambulance crews to find people, roads etc. Board said they would like to understand more what the issues are, costs, and how will the ambulance people fund the costs other than grants if you can't find any and how will it be done. If they can find out more information come back.
- 2. Economic Resiliency plan**-TM had copy of the proposal for the plan and the costs for the board to review and approve. TM said with the challenges the fishing industry is facing, the Covid market problems with the economy and climate change it is really important we figure out some planning and strategies to deal with the downturn in fisheries going forward and what we can or cannot do to address it. The fee would be \$35K for the consulting work and planning. Motion by John Steed, 2nd by Dick to approve. 5-0
- 3. MDOT winter road management discussion**-TM went over some items brought up at a Zoom meeting she attended for the peninsular roads with Pete Coughlin. TM said they were pushing using no sand and just salt so you don't have to clean ditches, etc. TM said she had found since we had the salt wells our roads are

not as good as the States which tend to be wider, more heavily traveled, break snow up faster whereas our town roads are narrower, more corners, hills and traveled less to break up snow and ice. DOT is still pushing the issue, but TM said it is good to be aware of what others are doing and what DOT might do to us if we don't do what they want some day on the State contracted roads we do for them.

4. **Projects updates & progress.** – TM mentioned a few items. Mix up with benefit concert location, it is at the Fish Pier not the Ballfield. #3 Hoist boom was broken by Drew Eaton's truck, doing repairs now for a new boom, will call on mooring plan again, paving BCM end was relayed to Skip's crew for Sand beach road, we are on Bypass again for trash, bills will be high, we have a crew coming from Bowdoin College to work on the 20th year of the asset mapping for a collaborative effort with HIP. Will be nice to have that work done and interesting looking over the old papers what changes have taken place over the years.
